

God Works for Those Who Wait For Him Uniqueness of God

Isaiah 64:1-4; 46:1-4

Thesis: The Bible says several times that our God is utterly unique among all the gods in the world and in history. But what makes him so unique?

Introduction:

- 1. Psalm 20:7
- 2. No other god works for those who wait on Him!
- I. Background and context of Isaiah 64
 - A. Isaiah 63 and 64 are one thought, a prayer of lament where Isaiah recalls how God had frequently rescued Israel from her enemies.
 - B. The prayer recalls the great wonders and acts of God and praises Him for:
 - 1. _____(ls. 63)
 - 2. ____(ls. 63)
 - C. The prayer laments that they are now suffering (ls. 63:18-19; cf. Psalm 22)
- II. God is unique: Call for God to act like He had in the past (Is. 64:1-4)
 - A. Often times when we want God to do a new thing we call on Him to remember how He did old things. (Exodus 15:2, 11, 18)
 - B. Vs 1-3 There is no other God who shows up like You do (Psalm 12:3)
- III. What makes God Unique? (Is. 64:4)
 - A. There isn't any other God like this God: "For from days of old they have not heard or perceived by ear, Nor has the eye seen a God besides You..." (Cf. 1 Cor. 2:6-10)
 - B. Contrast between Jehovah God and the false gods

Applications:

- 1. Psalm 20:7; "Some *boast* in chariots and some in horses, But we will boast in the name of the Lord, our God."
- Structure your prayers with praise for how great God has been in your life and in the life of others. (Exodus 15:2, 11, 18; 46 The LORD lives! Praise be to my Rock! Exalted be God my Savior! 49 Therefore I will praise you, LORD, among the nations; I will sing the praises of your name. Psalm 18:46, 49)
- 3. Recall that God has always carried you, since you were in your mother's womb and will carry you till your gray haired head rests on the pillow.
- 4. Give God the glory for there is no other God like Jehovah
- 5. Learn to wait on the Lord, learn to go when He says to go and to stay when He tells you to wait.
- 6. Give up your idols.

Study Questions

1. Read Isaiah 64:1–4. Isaiah says in verse 4 that God is utterly unique. From this passage, describe what makes God so unique from other gods?

2. What do you learn about Bel and Nebo in Isaiah 46:1–4? Do you see similarities with other popular gods or religions today?

3. How does Isaiah 46:1–4 reinforce or support the uniqueness you were seeing in Isaiah 64:1–4? Are there any new dimensions in these verses?
