Embarrassed?

Most of us are reluctant to accept a gift...

"Oh, you shouldn't have..."

"You don't have to do that..."

When we do give a gift, in order to make the receiver feel comfortable we say:

"This is a little something I want to give to you..."

"This is really nothing but I want to give you a gift..."

Maybe our hesitation to accept a gift comes from an independent streak.

Accepting a gift may seem like we need help and bruise our sense of self-reliance.
