- Hebrews 12 looks forward and upward

Hebrews 12 talks about a great cloud of witnesses - this is what makes heaven!

Mountain climb from Old Testament things and now we have made it to the top, the mountain peak.

In Hebrews 11 we saw the great men and women of faith, not we've made it to the top and see Jesus see heaven! in Hebrews 12.

Hebrews 1-11 was looking backwards and downward (back to Old Testament and downward to a physical reward

Hebrews 12 looks forward and upward to the heavenly reward

Great cloud of witnesses - what makes heaven are not the things (streets of gold), but the people there. A family makes a home.


Not every encumbrance is sinful - these may be relationships, employment, sports, etc...



Isaiah 53:3-5

3 He was despised and forsaken of men, A man of sorrows and acquainted with grief; And like one from whom men hide their face He was despised, and we did not esteem The prophet spoke of how much Jesus would be persecuted by His own countrymen, and then the Romans.

Jesus knew the race, saw the starting line, the course and the finish line. He knew the obstacles that would be in His way and all the stumbling blocks that would be used to destroy Him. Even so, at the sound of the starting gun He plowed right through! (Philippians 2:3-11)

There are many who cannot or are not willing to run the race, but as soon as they find out that you are in the race will do everything they can to disqualify you. They will persecute you, they will malign you, just like they did Christ.

Remember that we are past Hebrews 11 where we talked about the great men and women of faith who ran the race with endurance. We have reached the summit, the mountaintop and now we focus our eyes not on men, not on women, but on JESUS who is the Author (Originator) and Perfecter of faith (Hebrews 2:2)

So, be ready for persecution, be ready for scoffers, be ready for roadblocks - in the form of diseases, divorces, disasters- but never take your eyes off the ultimate example of the One who finished the race because of the joy that was set before Him. And that joy would be to sit at the right hand of God the Father!

For Christianity there will always be a cross. Jesus was a very sensitive man. Isaiah says that He despised that He was despised. When you can say I despise being despised then you can say you have won the race.

We lose sight of the future

Jesus looked not only to the finish line, but at the reward on the other side of the finish line - the throne.

We need to run not with our eyes fixed on the finish line but on the reward!

Illustration of when I was a track coach- almost all beginner runners run fast, extremely fast until the reach the finish line, they slow down! And, if the race is a close one, they lose the race because they slowed down at the finish line. When I trained with 4-H we trained horses to never see a finish line, but to see a reward.

You Will Suffer More as a Christian



"Come to Jesus and all your troubles will be over."

Jesus came to Jesus and His troubles got worse!

The idea that coming to Jesus will make you life in this world easy is a satanic lie. We will suffer more than ever because now the satanic forces are against us. However, the promise is that Jesus has overcome the world and so can we.

Esau was a big, hairy man, a hunter. First in line for the blessing.

Out he came from his mother's womb first and his twin brother second holding on to him by the ankle.

Esau was in the running for the blessing, and so was Jacob.

One day Esau saw a plate of beans and was faced with a choice- a choice that many young people are faced with- a choice between right now or later.

The visible and invisible.

Between something that is only a promise and something you can actually have.

Between the spiritual and the physical.

Between the spirit and the flesh.

Esau made the fatal choice that moment. He was out of the running. He should have been the father of Israel, he was the 1st born.

But he was disqualified from running.

1 Cor. 9:27; "but I strictly discipline my body and make it my slave, so that, after I have preached to others, I myself will not be disqualified."

Esau could not wait to run the race with patience, he could not run with endurance, he could not wait, he wanted his beans now not later. Jacob, on the other hand was patient enough to run the race with patience and he received the blessing.

Esau was the root of bitterness

Esau was immoral

Esau was idolatrous

After Esau was rejected (disqualified) he wanted his blessing and all the tears and vows of vengeance could not get it back, he found no place for repentance.

Esau regretted but could never repent. Someone can regret the consequences of being disqualified but not change their mind of what happened. And this is what happened to Esau.

This is the tragedy when we get disqualified from the race. We cannot drop off and drop in of the race at will. God cannot be mocked!
