Two dimensions - spiritual/physical

"Now may the God of peace Himself sanctify you entirely; and may your spirit and soul and body be <u>kept complete</u>, without blame at the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ." 1 Thess. 5:23

"For the word of God is living and active, and sharper than any two-edged sword, even penetrating as far as the division of soul and spirit, of both joints and marrow, and able to [a]judge the thoughts and intentions of the heart." Heb. 4:12

Animals have body and life, but not an eternal spirit

Animals die and cease to exist, man has personhood in the image of God.


Adam/we were made from dust, but that does not make us humans, the breath of God fused us with His likeness (Gen. 2:7; 1:26-27; Mat. 10:20)

Conception:

Life begins at conception and the body is united with the spirit - thus a living soul - (Father of Spirits Hebrews 12:9); (I will give thanks because I am awesomely and wonderfully made..and my soul knows it very well Psalm 139:14-16); 2 Cor. 5:1

The spirit is what departs and ascends when the body dies (Gen. 35:18 - during Benjamin's birth his morther's spirit departed as she died; Luke 23:46 - Into Your hands I commend My spirit)

God Sorts - 1

- God Sorts (Luke 16:9-31)
- Dead are still alive
- Earthly status no longer matter
- Dead no longer have a body Dead are conscious
- Dead retain their identities One knows destiny

At death God sorts people into two groups: saved and lost (Luke 16:19-31)

Dead continue to live: rich man and Lazarus continued to live on in eternity

Earthly status no longer mattered-neither rich or poor mattered

Dead no longer had physical bodies (2 Cor. 5:1-8)

Dead are conscious rich man realized he was in torment

Dead retain their identities and recognize each other (recognized Lazarus and Abraham)

At death our destinies are sealed, judgment day final sentence, and reason will be revealed

2 Cor. 5:10 - For we must all appear before the judgment seat of Christ, so that each one may receive compensation for his deeds *done* through the body, in accordance with what he has done, whether good or bad.

Ecc. 12:13-14 - For God will bring every act to judgment, everything which is hidden, whether it is good or evil.

Death is necessary in order to move on into eternity

1 Cor. 15:50 - "Now I say this, brothers and sisters, that flesh and blood cannot inherit the kingdom of God; nor does the perishable inherit the imperishable."

No matter what happens to our bodies (dust, cremated) one day they will be resurrected

1 Cor. 15:22 - "For as in Adam all die, so also in Christ all will be made alive."

John 5:28-29 - "a time is coming when all who are in the tombs will hear His voice, 29 and will come out: those who did the good *deeds* to a resurrection of life, those who committed the bad *deeds* to a resurrection of judgment."

Rev. 20:13 - "And the sea gave up the dead who were in it, and Death and Hades gave up the dead who were in them; and they were judged, each one *of them* according to their deeds.

The living at 2nd coming will be changed (1 Cor. 15:51-52)

"...we will not all sleep, but we will all be changed, **52** in a moment, in the twinkling of an eye, at the last trumpet; for the trumpet will sound, and the dead will be raised imperishable, and we will be changed."

Resurrected bodies will be immortal (1 Cor. 15:42-55), and our bodies will be like Christ's (Phil. 3:20-21; 1 Thess. 3:13; 4:13-17)

God Judges

God Judges (2 Cor. 5:10)

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2 Corinthians 5:10

10 For we must all appear before the judgment seat of Christ, so that each one may be recompensed for his deeds in the body, according to what he has done, whether good or bad.

2 Corinthians 5:10

Judgment Scene: Rev. 20:12-15: "And I saw the dead, the great and the small, standing before the throne, and [a]books were opened; and another [b]book was opened, which is *the book* of life; and the dead were judged from the things which were written in the [c]books, according to their deeds. **13** And the sea gave up the dead who were in it, and Death and Hades gave up the dead who were in them; and they were judged, each one *of them* according to their deeds. **14** Then Death and Hades were thrown into the lake of fire. This is the second death, the lake of fire. **15** And if [d]anyone's name was not found written in the book of life, he was thrown into the lake of fire."

At judgement God will reward:

Good deeds: Matthew 16:27; "For the Son of Man is going to come in the glory of His Father with His angels, and will then repay every person according to his [a]deeds."

Evil deed: Gal. 5:21; "envy, drunkenness, carousing, and things like these, of which I forewarn you, just as I have forewarned you, that those who practice such things will not inherit the kingdom of God."

Two Destinations for man when he dies: • Hell • Fire • Pain • Shame

Man Lives

There are only to destinations for man when he dies: heaven or hell (John 5:29)

Hell:

Fire: (Mat. 3:11-12; 13:42; Mk. 9:43-48; Rev. 20:14)

Pain: place where worm never dies, prison with no rest, fire never burns out, darkness (Mat. 8:12; Mk. 9:43-48; Rev. 14:11)

Shame: "but the others to disgrace and everlasting contempt." (Dan. 12:2)

Main WHERE DO WE GO WHEN WE DIE? H E B R E W S 9 : 2 7

Death is feared by most if not all, but it is such a sweet release for those who die in Christ.

What makes death feared by many is that of the unknown:

Don't know the destiny

Don't know what happens

Don't know what to do to make sure we make it to heaven...

But all those questions and doubts are not necessary because the Bible indeed gives us the answers!
