Pantheism

a philosophical worldview in which all of reality can be reduced to one "thing" or "substance."

God is the ultimate existing One. He is the only being who is independent and self-existent. All other existing things -the universe-derive their existence from God, who created all things ex nihilo (out of nothing).

Law of Attraction

The law of attraction is a philosophy suggesting that positive thoughts bring positive results into a person's life, while negative thoughts bring negative outcomes. Thinking about being wealthy will attract wealth.

Our financial success is determined by our decisions, our hard work, and our wise stewardship of what we have. No matter how positive our thoughts and how focused our mind is on wealth, if we have built mountains of debt, the bills will continue to come (<u>Proverbs 22:7</u>).

Chapter 11: New Spirituality: Just a woke way of saying idolatry – I Don't Need God, I am "God."

A group of progressive people met in a funkysmelling-smoked-filled basement, sitting in the sukhasana⁸⁴ position. All of them chanted "namaste" with the goal of aligning their chakras and achieving **Christ Consciousness**.⁸⁵ I was invited to a **New Age/New Spirituality** meeting for my research. What I witnessed was a throwback to Woodstock and the Beatles revolution. Men wore rose-colored glasses, most sported bell-bottom pants, psychedelic tie-dyed shirts, and carried murses (man-purses). Some danced to The 5th Dimension's <u>Age of Aquarius.⁸⁶</u>

After the "ritual" no one attained Christ Consciousness, but two claimed they got close.

Christ Consciousness (according to the New Age Movement) is the state of mind when one realizes he is divine and one with deity as Jesus realized He was Christ after He suffered and survived. Once Jesus realized He was the Christ then he attained Christ Consciousness then could stop Him. According to this foolishness, humans have the same ability - to come in tune with oneself with the aid of astrology, yoga, seances, and tarot cards; the occult, channeling of the dead, and whatever else is needed to help bring the individual to achieve the perfect state of one's own deification. (Arcoleo) (Piippo). One becomes their own god, if not in this life in the one to come through reincarnation.

Visualizations

Visualization is the use of mental concentration and directed imagery in the attempt to secure particular goals, whether physical, psychological, vocational, educational, or spiritual. Visualization attempts to program the mind to discover inner power and guidance. It is often used as a means to, or in conjunction with, altered states of consciousness (e.g., as produced by meditation), and is frequently used to develop psychic abilities or make contact with spirits. There are at least four identifiable types of visualization in our culture: academic, popular, occult, and Christian.



Yoga

The word yoga comes from the Sanskrit word yogah, which means "to yoke or to unite." As such, the goal of yoga is to uncouple oneself from the material world and to unite oneself with the God of Hinduism, commonly understood to be Brahman, the impersonal cosmic consciousness of the universe. Put another way, yoga is the means by which the user's mind is merged into the universal mind.



Tarot/Divination

Tarot cards are associated with divination—unlocking the secrets of the future by occult, supernatural means. Divination is strictly prohibited in the Bible. The word divination comes from the Latin divinare, meaning "to foresee" or "to be inspired by a god." To practice divination is to uncover hidden knowledge by supernatural means. It is associated with the occult and involves fortune-telling or soothsaying, as it used to be called.



Age of Pisces

The Age of Pisces defines the time where human beings engaged more than ever in the the matters of the soul. The ideas of human transcendence, dissolution of the self and connection to a higher ideal consolidated in the collective consiousness and took shape in various forms.



Age of Aquarius

An astrological era believed to bring increased spirituality and harmony on Earth. Many try to connect this myth to Luke 22:10. There are varied views of when this age will begin, although most agree that the transition has begun. Woodstock and the hippie era ushered in the movement.

What is New Age and New Spirituality (NAM)?⁸⁷

The true essence of the "New Age" movement can be summarized quite simply;

EVERYONE CAN CREATE THEIR OWN REALITY,

BECAUSE EVERYONE IS THEIR OWN GOD.

What is NAM? "New Age Spirituality is an umbrella term that describes a contemporary religious movement, not an organized religion. Proponents of the movement encourage striving to reach one's full potential through an eclectic mixture of concepts and practices drawn from Eastern mysticism, Hinduism, Buddhism, metaphysics, naturalism, astrology, occultism, and science fiction. In its various forms, New Age spirituality is both monistic (believing that all reality is ultimately one) and pantheistic (believing that everything is divine). Unlike organized religions, New Age spirituality has no founding figure, structured leadership, official headquarters, or authoritative writings that are accepted by all proponents. New Age spirituality has held considerable social sway over Western culture over the past three decades. An estimated one in three Americans accepts various elements of New Age ideology." (H Bavinck et al., Reformed Dogmatics / 2, God and Creation / Herman Bavinck ; John Bolt, General Ed. ; John Vriend, Transl. [from the Dutch].)

There are many forms and flavors of New Age Spirituality, and its packaging and delivery

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depend on the time and prevailing trends. "New Age is a range of spiritual or religious practices and beliefs which rapidly grew in Western society during the early 1970s. Its highly eclectic and unsystematic structure makes a precise definition difficult. Although many scholars consider it a religious movement, its adherents typically see it as spiritual or as unifying Mind-Body-Spirit, and rarely use the term New Age themselves."

Most New Age followers deny Christianity as most people understand Christianity, but are religious in the idolatrous sense. It is their desire to become one with the spirit realm in some fashion - be it the universe, nature, cosmos, etc. In essence, almost every guru from times past to present teach that the ultimate goal is nirvana.

Nirvana has its origin in the 5th century B.C. with wealthy young man named a man named Siddhartha Gautama.

Gautama started to question the spiritual value of his opulent life and made the decision to relinquish all of his belongings and emotional ties, including his wife and young child. He aimed to comprehend the genuine essence of existence and perceived all of his connections as hindrances. Gautama became a vagrant without a home, surviving with only the bare necessities, fasting to the extent of near starvation. Legend has it that after Siddhartha embarked on this path, he attained enlightenment. While meditating under a tree, he witnessed his own past lives as well as those of others. Gradually, he acquired a flawless, all-knowing understanding of this world and the world beyond. In Buddhism, this state, which the Buddha couldn't relate in language, is called **nirvana**. The word is Sanskrit for "to extinguish." In this case, it means to extinguish ignorance, hatred and earthly suffering. The term is most closely associated with Buddhism, though it's applied to a similar concept in Hinduism. (Nhất Hạnh, Thích)

By reaching nirvana, one can break free from **samsara**, the cycle of **reincarnation** present in both Hinduism and Buddhism. Every soul is rewarded or punished in each life based on their past actions or **karma**, accumulated from their current and past lives (including animal lives). It's important to note that **karma** is not a result of divine judgment, but more similar to **Newton's law of motion - every action has an equal and opposite reaction**, occurring automatically. (Ibid)

Achieving **nirvana** means that one stops accumulating bad **karma** as they have transcended it. The rest of their life, and sometimes future lives, are spent "working off" any bad karma already accumulated. (Ibid)

When one has fully escaped the karmic cycle, they attain **parinirvana** - the ultimate state of **nirvana** - in the afterlife. Similar to Hindu **nirvana**, souls that have attained **parinirvana** are liberated from the cycle of **reincarnation**. The Buddha did not provide any details about what **parinirvana** entails. In Buddhist philosophy, it is beyond the scope of ordinary human understanding. (Ibid)

Its Origin

Tracing the exact origin of New Age Religion is difficult. However, **Genesis 3** provides insight from the Bible's perspective.

In Tina Kolniak's story on how she managed to leave the New Age Religion she says, "New Age spirituality feeds your ego by teaching that there is no right, no wrong, no objective truth—just a landscape of experiences that your soul goes through. It gives you false idols to worship, starting with yourself, teaching that you are always perfect where you are. It also teaches you to rely on spiritual experiences rather than rationality." (Kolniak). Satan convinced Eve that by taking matters into her own hands, she could become like God, with god-like knowledge and enlightenment. This is the aim of New Age Spirituality.

Idolatry is at the heart of New Age Spirituality. In almost every New Age Spiritual practice



the occult is used in some way - stones (massage stones for chakras), tea leaves, tarot cards, astrology, yoga, meditation techniques, mediumship, seances, mysticism, Zen meditation, planetary healing, I Ching, alternative medicine, channeling and use of Chrystals, psychic

readings, horoscopes, extraterrestrial, channeling the people from the "Ancient city of Atlantis," and science.



All this may sound silly to some people, but this is a multibillion dollar industry, and it is as attractive as the "apple"⁸⁸ to Eve. (Genesis 3). God offered Mankind paradise, yet that was not enough. Man lusted for something different, not something greater, but something

different. Lust of the eyes, lust of the flesh, and the pride of life drove Man out of Perfect Paradise and continues to drive Man to alternative spiritual paths seeking enlightenment. (Romans 1:18-19, 20-22)

New Age Spirituality is often attributed to Indian and Hindu religions, but this is not entirely accurate. The roots of this movement can be traced back to the story of Adam and Eve and have been present in every generation since. While questioning beliefs is not inherently wrong, progressive thoughts have led many to seek their own spiritual paths



wrong, progressive thoughts have led many to seek their own spiritual paths separate from God. The 1960s saw a surge in drug-induced enlightenment, thanks to the love and peace generation. Marijuana, LSD, and Acid were often used during so-called head trips, with users justifying the practice as a means of expanding consciousness. Even today, it is common practice in New Age Practice to use some type of chemical, whether legal or illegal to reach a state of mental altered consciousness.

Common Beliefs

Cosmological determination

Many astrologers believe that the positioning of stars and other celestial bodies significantly impacts the development of society and individuals. The **Age of Pisces**, in which people were focused on discovering their identity and existence, has now passed and we are in the **Age of Aquarius**. <u>A desire for unity and peace characterizes this era</u>. (Zengal). As a result, it is believed cultural changes are taking place and will continue to do so. To fully embrace this new age, we must let go of the beliefs and traditions influenced by the Piscean era. Instead, we should accept ourselves as individuals who do not need to rely on external beliefs. The idea that everything **in us and in the universe** (idolatry) is God is central to this new age, and we should strive to connect with this divine energy. This belief system, known as **pantheism**⁸⁹, acknowledges that the created order is part of God's eternal sovereignty.

• Monistic energy

Some followers of the New Age movement believe in the concept of God and the universe being a single entity. They reject the idea of biblical monotheism and instead believe in **monism**⁹⁰ or **pantheism**. According to these beliefs, <u>every part of the universe contains divine energy</u>, and in order to <u>tap into this energy and regain personal power</u>, one must achieve harmony with all aspects of the universe. The New Age movement presents <u>various methods to achieve this unity</u>, including ancient and modern forms of <u>meditation</u>, <u>seances</u>, <u>divination</u>, <u>numerology</u>, and <u>incantation</u>. <u>Practicing yoga</u> is also believed to aid the pursuit of balance and harmony in the New Age quest. (Ibid)



• Law of Attraction


This is likely the most well-known belief. It suggests that if we maintain a positive mindset and have faith, **God will grant us our every desire**. The <u>Law of Attraction</u> <u>operates on the principle that "like attracts like."</u> Those who teach this law often

advise us to have faith, imagine, or picture what we want from God, and He will make it come true for us.

⁸⁹ the belief that God and the universe are the same thing. The term comes from the Greek words "pan" and "theos", which mean "all" and "God" respectively. Pantheists believe that God is present in everything in the universe and nature. They believe that the universe, earth, and nature are divine and should be treated as sacred. The majority of Prosperity Gospel Preachers teach this falsehood (often "acronymned" LOA) - Joel Olsteen, T.D. Jakes, Kenneth Hagin, Kenneth Copeland, Oral Roberts, Joel Osteen, Creflo Dollar, Benny Hinn, Paula White, et al. Take a look at the images below from a pastor's website:



The "Read more here..." icon opens up a YouTube video that shows a blonde with cash raining on her. This is from a Christian pastor promising an "automatic pilot" program to "manifest" and "attract" money and women. Again, this is Eve's "apple" the devil offered in Genesis 3 - the lust of the eyes, the lust of the flesh, and the pride of life. However, Christians must remember that our ultimate reward is in heaven. Our duty is to have faith and love God above everything else, not the things of this world (1 John 2:15).



Joel Olsteen, one of America's most famous LOA and Prosperity Gospel preachers teaches the following:

- Life and death is in the power of our tongue.
- Thank God in advance for your victory.
- Don't pray away your problems trust you'll be right where you should be when the winds are done blowing.
- Relinquish control to God. (Stop worrying, stop losing sleep.)
- Let go of what didn't work out.
- God is for you, and wants you to make big bold requests.
- Make room for something big; you haven't seen your best days yet.
- The first place we lose the battle is in our own thinking. Break free in your thinking!
- Dismiss those negative thoughts; release yourself from your limitations.
- Start talking, thinking and acting like your victory is going to happen.
- Speak the seeds of faith into being: "I am blessed, I am healthy, I am strong, I am victorious."
- Take your praise to God, not your problems.
- Call the things that are not as if they already were.

What's wrong with these mantra sayings? Probably nothing, on the surface, and most can find their origin in the Scriptures. However, it's the wrapping that should concern us. The nugget of truth is wrapped with lies. For example, read Joel's explanation on why God made Zechariah mute after he told him his wife would give birth to John the Baptist: "Why did God take away his speech? It's because God knew that Zechariah's negative words would cancel out His plan....See, God knows the power of our words. He knows we prophesy our future. And He knew Zechariah's own negative words would stop His plan." (Olsteen). According to Olsteen, man has the power to change God's divine and eternal plan by just speaking. How arrogant as this places man above God!

• Follow your heart

In the self-help section, this has already been discussed. The New Age Movement uses the same deception. What could be wrong with the idea of following your heart? What could go wrong? Well, many tragedies have started with people following their hearts. I'm reminded of a young lady who found out her partner had been unfaithful. Her solution? Her heart told her to get wasted the entire day and see what would unfold. There is no need to go into details how her night ended, one need only to imagine. The Scriptures warn us against following our hearts. Hearts (mind) need to be trained; if not trained properly, it will be like the blind leading the blind. "Whoever trusts in his own mind is a fool, but he who walks in wisdom will be delivered." (Proverbs 28:26; Jeremiah 17:9).

The risk of following our emotions is that the enemy can manipulate us, leading us away from God's will and towards sinful behavior. The heart is emotional and inconsistent. Acting on an emotions and inconsistency is a recipe for disaster.

• We are little or mini gods Self-deification



Oprah Winfrey popularized a book called "The Secret". In it, the author, Rhonda Byrne, argues that humans can control every aspect of their lives through the Law of Attraction and energy. Byrne claims that individuals can write their own destinies and shape every event in their lives based on their thoughts. Some proponents of this philosophy even suggest that people can "claim" what they want and it will come to them. For instance, if someone desires to be cured from cancer, they simply need to declare it and they will be healed. Similarly, if someone desires to own a Maserati car, they only need to speak it into existence. However, this belief implies that individuals are their own gods.



The idea that sprinkling a little Bible and theology can attract masses and make one wealthy is prevalent in the church. However, this approach often promotes serving oneself and the desire for material wealth and fame. It presents a distorted view that Jesus died so we could have everything we want in this life. Although this may sound appealing, the Bible consistently teaches that God is holy, righteous, omnipresent and omniscient, while man has sinned and only through the death of Christ can one be made blameless before God, not through our own innate divinity.

Jeffery Ressner 's Time Magazine piece, "The Secret of Success," exposes the book's purpose. He wrote, "The film's backers say they deliberately aimed to make "wealth enhancement" a major element of the project. "We desired to hit the masses, and money is the number one thing on the masses' minds," says Bob Rainone, a former IBM salesman and telcom exec who now serves as Byrne's U.S. business partner. Wealth enhancement is also part of *The Secret's* business plan." (Ressner)

• All roads lead to heaven

The New Age Movement teaches that no one religion is right and none are wrong, but that all have the answers because truth is subjective. Truth is what you want it to be. (This is why if a person desires to identify as a tiger he can be a tiger, it is his truth.). However, Jesus stated He is the Way, the Life, and the Truth. There is One Way, One Life, and One Truth. We may not like the One Way, One Truth, and One Life, but that does not change it. (John 14:6; Matthew 7:13; 2 Timothy 4:3)



The idea that there are no absolutes is extremely enticing in every generation. Some "cultural experts" call this phenomenon the cultural revolution, but every generation seems to experience this stage at some point - question and rebel against the status quo. "Live your truth?" The idea of creating our own truths can be tempting as it gives us the freedom to justify anything we do. For instance, if you are tired of having only one sexual partner even though you are married, you can justify it by creating your own truth that monogamy means your heart belongs to one person while your body can be open to many others. This way, you can avoid the inner conflict and excuse your actions. However, this may lead to moral and ethical concerns.

There is nothing godly about rejecting absolutes and one truth. "Jesus saith unto him, I am the way, the truth, and the life: no man cometh unto the Father, but by me." (John 14:6) Jesus is the Truth, He is the only Way, and He is the Life. There is no option left in His Word for substitutions and personal truths. "Woe unto them that call evil good, and good evil; that put darkness for light, and light for darkness; that put bitter for sweet, and sweet for bitter!" (Isaiah 5:20) "No servant can serve two masters: for either he will hate the one, and love the other; or else he will hold to the one, and despise the other. Ye cannot serve God and mammon." (Luke 16:13)

These verses teach that there is good and evil. Adam and Eve disobeyed by serving two opposing forces, which destroyed the concept of love and loyalty. There is only one road that leads to enlightenment and His name is Jesus!

Its Appeal and Influence among Christians

Karma! Good and bad **karma**. "**Karma** will get you in the end." If you have ever heard these words understand they come from the New Age Movement. Unfortunately, many <u>Christians</u> either believe in **karma** or somehow participate in it indirectly. Karma is the relationship between a person's mental or physical action and the consequences following that action. Karma is also known as "bad juju," "the evil eye," "jinx," and "what goes around comes around." Another common karma-related concept is "no one leaves this world without paying for what they have done."

Karma is only one area of New Age beliefs that many Christians hold to as a belief system. This does not mean Christians are abandoning their religious beliefs for New Age Spirituality beliefs, but it does mean that many Christians have bought into these ideas and beliefs in addition to Christianity. Many will say, "I'm not superstitious, but..." Or, "I don't

believe in karma, but..." And, "I think the traffic gods were against me today because..." Whether these things are said flippantly or not, these beliefs are at the heart of the New Age Movement.

Quija Boards have been a staple among teens as a fun and "innocent" game. Many people see Ouija boards as harmless entertainment. Others believe Ouija boards are magic tools, portals to other dimensions, or divining oracles that allow spirits of the dead to communicate with the living. They are often considered to be communication gateways to those who have "passed over," and those who sit around a Ouija board are participating in a séance. Of course, this is based on the supposition that spirits, or ghosts, exist in the first place and that they can, or even want to, communicate with the world of the living. The number of young Christians engaging in playing with the Quija boards has increased tremendously.

Movies:

Disney - It is worth considering how New Age occultism is being marketed to children, particularly in light of **Hitler's quote, "He alone, who owns the youth, gains the future"** (Hitler, 1935). The promotion of occultism to children can be seen in various media, such as movies, TV shows, books and video games. However, the earliest promoter of this theme was



Disney. In the 1937 movie "Snow White," magic was used as a major theme in the storyline, and it has continued to be a recurring theme in many of Disney's cartoons, along with the supernatural portrayal of talking animals. In fact, Disney's tagline is "The Magic Kingdom." It is important to note that the Bible strongly condemns witchcraft in several places. Therefore, even though it may be popular with many Christians, Disney does not promote a Christian worldview and, in fact, promotes a New Age worldview.

How popular is Disney? In addition to the fantasy-based animation, Disney was a groundbreaker in the 1950s by having a theme park as a travel destination for families. This shows that a Disney animation is not just a onetime event to view on a movie screen, but families can embrace the "Magic Kingdom" by spending their family vacations immersing children in the "magic" experience to continue the fantasy. During opening year in 1955, Disney had its one-millionth visitor. By 1965, 50 million have visited. (Parker)

"Disney magic is even more elusive. Some say it is in the attractions, some say it is in the atmosphere, and some credit the can-do attitude of the Cast Members. But nearly everyone who visits the parks agrees: The magic is there; they just can't quite put their finger on where. And like the magician, Disney's magic also lies in the slight of hand, the hidden detail." (Veness)

Star Wars - Howe and Geisler in their book The Religion of the Force wrote; "We say that the Force best fits a conceptual model of God that is "mostly **pantheistic**" (in which all that is real is part of God) because many of the truth claims about the Force fit the **pantheistic** model well. One clear example of this can be heard when Obi Wan explained that the Force is, "an energy field created by all living things. It surrounds us, penetrates us. It binds the galaxy together." This fits the pantheistic and panentheistic models of God



well. But we also recognize that George Lucas and his saga are highly syncretistic and not every claim about the Force fits one single model. Other religiophilosophical claims about the Force in Star Wars seem to have been influenced by elements from **Zoroastrian dualism**, **Manichean dualism**, **Taoism**, **Qigong**, **Prana**, **Zen Buddhism** and **Stoicism**. With some exceptions, many of these elements fit very naturally with **pantheism**." (Geisler & Howe 96)

Mega Churches and their Music:

Megachurches are growing at a rapid pace all over the Western World. Their business model is approaching smaller churches with an aging membership and offering them a dynamic speaker and financial security. Or as one NPR reporter noted, "You need a building, we need a pastor." (Neuman). They keep the older pastor, allow him to serve in a limited capacity until retirement, beam in the sermon

- Do not compete with the world; put the timeless message of Jesus into new wineskins
- Steer clear of politics

Hillsong church⁹² and **Hillsong United** have made their mark in the world with their magic-like light show and 7-11 songs (7 words repeated 11 times). These groups have influenced millions of young people almost to the cult level - some have even categorized them as a cult. (Frishberg). The media has done the public a favor by being enamored with the Hillsong pastors, celebrities (Justin Bieber, Jay-Z, Kardashians, Selena Gómez, Hailey Baldwin, Nick Jonas, Kevin Durant, Laura Lents, Kyrie Irving, Tyson Chandler, Vanessa Hudgens, Chris Pratt, Bono, Hailee Steinfeld, and Joe Jonas) and reporting extensively on the goings - on to the point where the public know a lot more about the inner workings of the cult than Hillsong would like. - The god they preach is more related to the Hindu deity who is unlimited and cannot be limited, compared to the Christian God who is limited; (i.e. God cannot lie, God cannot murder, etc).
- Their utopian and totalitarian ideology of church growth and community reflects the philosophies of the Volk and the Führerprinzip before Nazi Germany (visionary leadership)
- Their worship reflects the ideas of ancient Greece and their pagan festivals, believing the experiences they create are glimpses into the divine (a form of pagan mysticism/spiritism/gnosticism which Jesus spoke against)
- Their teaching on the Holy Spirit (the anointing) is more akin to the 'Third Eye' sense of the New Age movement, a teaching that bypasses the mind and calls things that are not physical into being or seeing into the future⁹⁴
- their teaching on purpose and destiny reflects New Age and Buddhist thought on self-actualisation/enlightenment philosophies.
- their general teachings reflecting not Christianity but the world's latest ideas repackaged, twisting the Christian bible to sell the idea where Hillsong needs to go (see their Vision Sunday broadcasts)


These megachurches along with their music have had an influence on many Christians. Their money and influence has been funneled into the movie industry in some form and fashion – either by financing in part or by publicly endorsing and encoring the membership to attend certain movie debuts. For example, the 2017 movie The Shack has at least thirteen New Age Movement themes and Joel Houston, Hillsong UNITED worship leader who writes a lot of Hillsong worship songs and is a major influence on many churches with his worship music said in a recorded video:

But if there's one film you see this year, it needs to be 'The Shack' because not only is it a beautiful story, I believe that it helps people see why they're here, what they're made for and has the potential to change your life. I believe it will. Get out and see it."

"I think Christian theists have a tremendous advantage over naturalists because theism has explanatory power. That is, when you look at the particular details of the Christian worldview, you can see how they fit the way the world actually is. There's an explanation there. This, by the way, this this fit between a point of view and the way the world is, is the classical definition of truth. When your claim fits the world, that's a true claim.

All right. So I'm just I'm talking here about now the truth of Christianity. There's a fit there. It has explanatory power in a way that naturalism does not have. All right. So

when you think about naturalist bumping into reality, what are some of those bumps?

What are those Some of those things that they can't explain that we can explain? What about stuff? Stuff. The world is filled with stuff. There's all kinds of stuff in the world. Where did everything come from? What a lot of stuff come from?

Well, what caused the beginning of the universe? Now, when we can, nobody seems to believe. And I think this is pretty sound now in terms of physics, that the universe was eternal. Everybody is pretty convinced, skeptics alike, that the universe came into existence at some point in time, is called the Big Bang. Here's my question. What or who bang the big bang? Big Bang needs a big bangger.

Right. That's the cosmological argument in a nutshell. So did the Big bang bang itself? Well, that doesn't seem to make any sense. You know, things just don't come into existence out of nothing. That's not our experience. If. If my wife came home and saw a Mercedes Benz SL in the garage and asked me where it came from, it wouldn't probably be very persuasive if I said. Just popped into existence Sunny with the keys in the ignition and my name on the license plate. I don't know where it came from. Those things happen, you know. Of course. No, those things don't happen. It doesn't make any sense. In answering the question what caused the universe it incidentally, you have one of two choices. Something or nothing. That's it. Something or nothing? It doesn't make any sense to say nothing because things don't just pop into the universe like that caused out of nothing.

This is it. Even if one were to argue, Well, it's possible on a quantum level or something like that. Look at what's the odds on favorite. The odds on favorite is the Mercedes Benz didn't just this was not a quantum event. You know it was the odds on favorite is something or someone is responsible for that and the same answer applies to the cosmos. Something or someone, at least in principle. But it's got to be a what caused that is adequate to the effect.

And when you look at what would be adequate to the effect, the beginning of the universe, it's going to be something powerful, something really smart, something who is

an agent. So there's a person, not a thing. And the reasons for these things, but certainly not nothing now. So for the bump up stuff, how do you explain stuff the the naturalist can't explain? It has no resources to explain it. The only thing you can say is everything came from nothing, which is patently ridiculous. It's worse than magic and magic. You have a you have a magician pulling

a rabbit out of the hat, and in this case, there's no hat and there's no magician, just a rabbit coming out. So this is this is not. But the theist can offer a rational explanation.

 Another factor must be considered. Western culture is rapidly becoming biblically illiterate, so that quoting a text of Scripture is not immediately believed or even recognized. As Craig Hazen says:

In years past it was not unusual that a believer could quote the Bible or "preach the Word" and have a good chance of engendering respect and perhaps deep reflection on the part of the unbeliever. This was possible because the Bible still carried significant cultural authority. An unbeliever would be likely to consider its words because there was a widespread recognition that the Bible was at the foundation of western civilization and brought wise counsel on many issues—even if the whole text was not considered true or without error by the skeptical recipient. Those days, however, are gone. There is a better than ever chance today that a person will actually consider you immoral for quoting the Bible because the Bible is often viewed, inappropriately of course, as misogynist, racist, violent, religiously exclusive and the basis for much of the conflict in our world.62 When Jesus spoke to a crowd of Jewish people, they shared belief in the Old Testament. When Peter spoke to the Jews on the Day of Pentecost, it was the same. When Paul spoke in the synagogues of the Jews, there was no debate on authority. However, when Paul came before pagans who had no knowledge of Scripture, he used another approach. He started from where they were and moved to the gospel..

And the final age, which the apostle John is shown in visions, is described as a renewed Eden and Jerusalem combined (Rev 21:9–22:5). Is it possible that Eden, or something akin to it, is our destination in the age to come? If so, then we ought to understand the basics of what went wrong in the first Eden.

Given the existence of a designer ready and willing to do the work, why should we suppose that random mutations and natural selection are responsible for such marvels of engineering as the eye and the wing?

CONCLUSION: If naturalism is incapable of accounting for 1) the creation of the universe and 2) our existence as free agents, then it is insufficient as a comprehensive worldview to explain the whole of reality.

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Ninety percent of human decisions are made based on emotions. Humans use logic to justify their actions to themselves and others.

According to Arthur Lefford, author of "The Influence of Emotional Subject Matter on Logical Reading," people generally think their decisions are made based on facts. The study found that when "people agree with a particular message, they tend to perceive it as being more logical or rational. On the other hand, when people disagree with the message, they perceive it as an emotional plea."

Ninety-five percent of purchase decisions are subconscious, according to Gerald Zaltman, a Harvard Business School professor.

The most common emotional decision is reactive (subconscious) decision-making. It is typically very fast, as it takes at least 0.1 seconds for the rational cortex to start responding.

"Common emotional decisions may use some logic, but the main driving force is emotion, which either overrides logic or uses a pseudo-logic to support emotional choices (this is extremely common).

Another common use of emotion in the decision is to start with logic and then use emotion in the final choice."

According to the neuroscientist Antonio Damasio's study conducted on people with brain injuries that damaged the part of their brains where emotions are generated, these injuries affected not only their ability to feel but also their ability to make decisions, which was seriously impaired. They were able to logically-describe what they should do, but with no rational way to decide, they were unable to make the decision.

The secret to The Secret's success is the effective way Byrne edits her interviews with 24 so-called 'teachers' — prosperity preachers, chiropractic healers, relationship gurus,

life coaches, motivational speakers and other empowerment hustlers — into one clear, cohesive voice. The teachers, many of whom have large audiences of their own, were also instrumental in promoting the DVD, touting it in e-mails to millions of their followers. 'The film delivers a timely message in a way that's accessible, whether or not you've ever explored this direction before,' says Hale Dwoskin, one of the two dozen featured teachers. Dwoskin, author of the personal growth guide The Sedona Method, believes 'the world is hurting and in turmoil. The distance between that trouble and our everyday lives has dissipated due to the widespread availability of cable news and the Internet. People are ready to find a way out beyond the normal paradigms we all live in.'

Critics of The Secret, and even some fans, are bothered by its obsession with using ancient wisdom to acquire material goods. In one segment, a kid who wants a red BMX bicycle cuts out a picture in a catalog, concentrates real hard, and is rewarded with the spiffy two-wheeler. The Secret"is like having the universe as your catalog," says Joe Vitale, who is called a "metaphysician" in the film but whose website bills him as "Mr. Fire" — a marketing consultant with the power to sway consumers with a "hypno-buying trance." "The get-rich-quick parts really bothered me," says Bodhi Tree buyer Harmony Allor . "It's my hope that people won't use creative visualization to obtain wealth for themselves, but in more positive, altruistic ways."

The film's backers say they deliberately aimed to make "wealth enhancement" a major element of the project. "We desired to hit the masses, and money is the number one thing on the masses' minds," says Bob Rainone, a former IBM salesman and telcom exec who now serves as Byrne's U.S. business partner. Wealth enhancement is also part of the The Secret's business plan. Among the spinoff books expected in 2007 are The Secret Workbook and a collection of The Secret Success Stories. Byrne will also begin filming a sequel to The Secret in January, for an August release; Rainone says it will explore "the next step, the next level" in the process of achieving one's life goals. Meanwhile, the original DVD is about to be distributed in Europe and Asia; German, Spanish and Portuguese translations are nearly completed, with French, Japanese and Chinese to follow..

I focused on the work of Ignatius, Polycarp and Clement and isolated the content of their non-canonical writings to the early Church. What did they say about Jesus? Did they ever reference the writings of the New Testament? It turns out that the Early Church Fathers did, in fact, quote the scripture as it was handed down to them. But even if we can't reconstruct the entire New Testament (save 11 verses) as Dalrymple is often quoted to have said, the Early Church Fathers did confirm enough of the New Testament claims to validate and authenticate the writings of the apostles. From the non-canonical works of Ignatius and Polycarp (students of John) and the non-canonical work of Clement (a student of Paul) we can determine the following:
